Message from Mr Whiteley

As this half term draws to a close, we can look forward to a much more stable time ahead. Although it is clear that COVID-19 will be a feature of our lives for some time still, restrictions are in the process of being removed and we can at least be confident that school will not go into lockdown again. With a return to normality next half term, students will no longer be permitted to eat their lunches and snacks in classrooms and open communal spaces. From 1st March, all food should be eaten in the canteen. Similarly, students will no longer be allowed to wear sweatshirts under blazers or coats in class. Staff and students who still feel vulnerable, will be permitted to continue to wear face coverings next half term.

You will be aware that Monday 28th February is a staff training day, students return to us on Tuesday 1st March. Please be aware that this year, the Easter break is later than normal and the term finishes on Friday 8th April making this next half term a 6-week block.

For all students accessing the school led tutoring programme, I would ask all parents and carers to ensure that students make the most of these additional sessions, if students miss consecutive sessions, their places will be offered to other students. As you might expect, we have a long waiting list.

For students in years 11, 12 and 13, examination timetables have now been published and will be distributed as soon as we are able. I would like to congratulate all of the students on their performance in the mock examination series. As well as some outstanding individual performances, the attitude and effort made by the whole cohort is a credit to you all. I understand the apprehension we all feel about the late changes in examinations and the potential impact of the lockdown, but the overwhelming feeling in school is one of confidence. To all of the students in those year groups, I would urge you to remember that time is short and preparation is everything! For all other year groups, there will be school-based examinations and tests shortly after Easter, these are more important than ever this year, because they will allow us to measure the impact of the disruption of the last two years and adapt our teaching to cover any gaps that have arisen.

Finally, I would like to thank you for your continued support; your donations to our food distribution programme, contributions to our charity efforts and letters of thanks to the staff are greatly appreciated. I hope that storm Eunice is kind to you and that you have a restful break. I look forward to seeing the students return safe and well on Tuesday 1^{st} March.

Maths Support Sessions

After the success of the first two support sessions, we are now offering another session to any parent who would like to attend. It will be an after school session on 8th March 2022 from 4pm – 5.15pm, which will demonstrate the ways in which we teach maths and how your son learns in our lessons.

This session will develop your own understanding of maths, in order to support your son with his maths work. By showing you different strategies of learning and teaching maths, as well as using the concrete manipulatives that we use in most of our maths lessons, we hope that you will come away from the session feeling much more confident in helping your son with his maths homework. If you have previously attended a session, you are more than welcome to come again, as we will be covering different aspects of the maths curriculum. This session will have a maximum capacity of 20 people and will be offered on a first come first served basis; however, we will also allow parents to join online via Zoom if needed.
