School Redevelopment

Following the announcement this week, we are delighted by the news that all of the older parts of our school are to be rebuilt including the main school building and technology wing. This means so much to us and to our community. The new building will give our students access to an educational experience that their talents deserve, and our community a place to be proud of.

As a STE@M (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Maths) Centre of Excellence, it has been difficult bringing 21st century technology to life in a building designed at the end of the Second World War.

Despite this, over the past few years the school has received numerous awards including STEM School of the Year and Outstanding Commitment to STEM. This new building will help us build on the excellent practice we have in an environment that matches our ambition for the boys.

Duke of Edinburgh's Gold Award

A group of eight students from The Protective Services Academy were on expedition this week in the Lake District. The week consisted of a climb up to 650m for a wild camp at Angle Tarn, a 12-mile trek along Ullswater, a micro-navigation day in the lowland fells of NE Cumbria, two nights further camping and finally a "hunted" style extraction morning from a secret location revealed to them only the night before. The participants were completely self-sufficient carrying all their camping equipment, food and water purification equipment. They acquitted themselves and the school incredibly well and received many positive comments from fellow walkers and campsite staff.





Duke of Edinburgh's Bronze Award



Last Friday and Saturday, a group of Year 10 and 11 completed the expedition section for their Bronze Awards with a 7-mile hike from Loggerheads to a campsite where they spent the night before returning to Loggerheads the following day.
