Art Department


It's competition time! All year groups welcome to enter.

Design & Technology

Some of our Year 8 classes have been working on a new systems and control project this term. We are focussing on sensors and inputs and using a piece of technology called a Datahive (pictured below). The students have been using the Datahives to sense, record and track inputs such as voltage, temperature, light levels and static charge. They are then using this information to consider solutions to environmental issues such as waste disposal, storage of energy and efficient food production.

Sixth Form drama students ventured to Manchester HOME Theatre to see *KIN*; a performance by Gecko Theatre Company who they are currently studying. This was an

incredible opportunity for the cohort, made even more unique by taking part in a Q&A with the artistic director Amit Lahav and meeting him afterwards.


Finally, Year 10 and 13 pupils took part in a *Curious Minds* workshop with former pupil Isaac Nixon, which explored poetry and graphic
