



Carl Leckey MBE who was the youngest of three children and spent his early years in wartime Britain. After leaving school, Carl served on the Mersey tugs for fifteen years, (except for two years national service) until being made redundant in 1968, having made the rank of Mate. His career then established him as a Leading Lock Keeper for British Waterways in Cheshire for some 28 years until ill health brought premature retirement.




In 1985 Carl was awarded a Winston Churchill Travelling Fellowship to study ports and harbour services in the USA and China and on returning from his travels, he undertook a series of lectures on his experiences abroad.

In 1995 he was awarded an MBE by the Queen for services to British waterways.




