3. Why was x seen as a significant threat to y during the reign of Elizabeth? (12)

Put the issue in context by providing background information from your own knowledge. Try to link the context to the key issue. Provide a conclusion that answers the question.

  - a. A
  - b. B
  - c. C
  - d. D (10)
