#### **Medication In School**

Most pupils will at some time have a medical condition that may affect their participation in school activities and for many this will be short-term. Other pupils have medical conditions that, if not properly managed, could limit their access to education. Most children with medical needs are able to attend school regularly and, with some support from the school, can take part in most normal school activities. We are committed to ensuring that children with medical needs have the same right of access as other children.

# **Prescribed Medication**

Prescribed medication should only be taken in school when essential. Parents are encouraged to ask their prescriber if the dose frequencies will allow the medicine to be taken out of school hours. We will

only accept medicines that have been prescribed by a doctor, dentist, nurse prescriber or pharmacist prescriber. Medicines must be provided in the original container as dispensed by the pharmacist and include the prescriber's instructions for administration. We will not accept medicines which have been taken out of their original containers nor make changes to dosages on parental instruction.

#### Non-Prescribed Medication

Where possible, the school will avoid administering non-prescription medicine. However, we may do so, if requested by the parent, if it will facilitate the child attending school and continuing their learning.

# **Emergency Inhalers**

In line with "Guidance on the use of emergency salbutamol inhalers in schools" March 2015, the school will keep emergency reliever (blue) inhalers for the emergency use of children whose own inhaler is not available for any reason. They will be stored in the main school office, along with appropriate spacers.

All medication stored in school is checked three times a year and parents are contacted as needed if medication needs to be updated or is out of date. Any questions or concerns please contact the SEND Department.
