A Message from	n Mr Whiteley	
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As we reach the end of our first month, I am excited to report that the new build project is gaining momentum. This will be a huge benefit to all the students and our hope is that the entire project will be completed in the next 2 calendar years.

It has been a busy start to the new term and our new system for reporting the achievement of children – Class Charts is proving really effective in helping us address the needs of children who are struggling. From next week, parents and students will have access to the app that will show homework and from the week beginning 10th October, parents will be able to access the rewards and sanctions section of the site. This will give parents a live stream as to how their child's day is going. This month, Class Charts has shown that over 90% of interactions are positive and this reflects the excellent start that many of our boys have made to the year.

You will be aware that we are insisting on full school uniform now that all restrictions imposed by the pandemic have been lifted. Students are not allowed to wear coats around the building. Our school uniform does include a plain grey or black v-neck jumper, which can be worn when the weather is cold underneath a blazer. Sweatshirts, fleeces and other such items cannot be worn in school. We encourage all of our students to bring bags so they can carry their coats around in school along with their schoolbooks. Please ensure your child's name is in all of his belongings especially coats, bags and PE kit. I would also like to remind parents to encourage pupils to have respect for all members of our community, so when travelling to and from school at the start and end of the day, they should not drop litter, damage property or be disrespectful to others. We will take action if this is reported to us, or if they bring the school into disrepute.

I would like to thank all of the parents and pupils who were involved in the school's open evening last Thursday, it was another very successful evening and all of the pupils involved were a credit to the school and their families. The feedback we gained from visiting parents and teachers from other schools was outstanding and I am very proud of all of them.

New Group Reading Tests for Year 7 Students

All students in Year 7 will be undertaking the New Group Reading Test on Tuesday 4th and Wednesday 5th October. NGRT is a formative assessment that is used to assess a student's reading level. Formative means that it does not count towards any final grade or result, but is used to find out your son's current ability level as compared to the national average and can allow us to identify students who may benefit from interventions and support or from being stretched further. Your son does not need to do anything to prepare for this test. The tests usually lasts for around 30 minutes and are completed in a computing suite.

Online Safety

The online world is posing an ever-increasing risk to children, and it is important that schools, parents and carers work together to take an active role in teaching children about online dangers. Learning how to act safely when using the Internet is an incredibly important part of safeguarding our children. We have shown our commitment to protecting our pupils online by working with National Online Safety providing resources for all parents and carers.
