News

Message from Mr Whiteley

As I am sure you will be aware, the National Education Union (NEU) have made the decision to take industrial action on the 1st and 28th February and again on the 15th and 16th March.

As a result of this action, and in order to protect those students studying for examinations this year, we will only open for students in years 11, 12 and 13. All other pupils, in years 7, 8, 9 and 10 must stay at home.

Where teachers are not taking industrial action, there will be online lessons delivered in real time. Pupils should log in on their Google Classroom account to access their lessons at the time identified on their normal timetable. Where the lesson is not delivered in real time, you should assume that the teacher is taking industrial action and, in these cases, your son should make use of the other learning materials available; Google Classroom, Sparx Maths or GCSEPod. We would encourage parents to ensure their son has access to these materials and to support him on the day to ensure minimum disruption to his learning.

The Mosslands School Super-Curriculum

Super-curriculum is a term used to describe an educational program that goes beyond the traditional curriculum, by providing students with additional learning opportunities and experiences that are not typically included in traditional school curriculums. This can include things like extracurricular activities,

internships and community service projects, as well as exposure to real world problems and issues. The importance of a super-curriculum for pupils' personal development is that it can help students develop a wide range of skills including critical thinking, problem solving, and communication skills. It can also help students become more engaged and motivated learners as well as prepare them for the real world and the workforce. Additionally it can expose students to diverse perspectives and cultures and promote their personal growth and development. Please see the attached flier for information on our super-curriculum.

Exam Readiness Sessions

These sessions are designed to help students prepare for upcoming exams by providing them with the necessary knowledge, skills and strategies to perform well in the exam. These sessions can be in the form of review sessions, study groups or practice exams. They are important as they can help students feel more prepared and confident when taking the exam. By reviewing key concepts and practising test taking strategies and getting feedback in their performance, students can better understand the material and feel more confident in their abilities. Additionally these sessions can help students identify areas where they need to focus more attention and improve study habits.

In addition to the academic benefits, exam readiness sessions can also have a positive impact on mental health and stress levels and time management. By providing students with a structured approach to studying and preparing for exams, students can feel more in control of their studying and less stressed about the upcoming exam. These are an important tool for helping students fulfil their academic potential and achieve successful outcomes.
